## Project update

The Clarke Creek Wind Farm – Stage 2 team are finalising the project layout for the change application to the existing State Approval. As part of this work, we are assessing impacts on traffic, transport, noise, visual, social and economic factors, and opportunities resulting from the project. Discussions have also taken place with Isaac Regional Council on the development of a Community Benefit Agreement in addition to the existing benefits provided by Clarke Creek Wind Farm – Stage 1.

The project will consist of 88 wind turbines. It will produce enough electricity to power about 390,000 Australian homes and avoid 542,000 tonnes of carbon emissions each year.



## Improving connectivity in Clarke Creek

We are excited to share that we have engaged Telstra to conduct a comprehensive feasibility study aimed at upgrading the Broadsound telecommunications tower. This initiative is a critical step toward enhancing mobile and internet connectivity for the Clarke Creek community. Reliable telecommunications are essential for safety, business operations, and everyday communication, and this upgrade will help ensure our region is better connected now and into the future.
