Project update

The Ballyrogan Wind Farm project has recently lodged its referral submissions with the Victorian and Commonwealth governments. In this edition, we outline what this important planning milestone means and the next steps in the assessment process.

Referrals submitted

Ballyrogan Wind Farm recently submitted an Environmental Effects Statement (EES) referral to the Victorian Government and an Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation (EPBC) referral to the Commonwealth Government.

These referrals allow Victorian Government and Australian Government agencies to determine the appropriate assessment pathways for the project, including the level of technical assessment required.

While the referrals are an important early step in the planning process, the project remains a proposal. Further studies, detailed design work and ongoing engagement will continue to inform its development. The referral documents are currently being reviewed by government and are not yet publicly available. Once the referrals are published, we will share more details with the community, including where the documents can be viewed online.

While the referral submissions are not a planning application, they do outline key project details and technical and environmental work completed to inform the project design.

Squadron Energy remains committed to keeping the community informed and involved as Ballyrogan Wind Farm progresses through each stage of planning and assessment.
