Project update

Welcome to the Spicers Creek Wind Farm update for September 2026.

It has been an exciting and productive period, with strong progress across project planning and preparation for future delivery readiness.

Since our last newsletter, the team has continued to build momentum in several key areas:

- The Dubbo advanced wastewater treatment facility has officially opened, marking a significant milestone for the project and the region.
- We are continuing to progress detailed design and contracting for the project.
- Planning is progressing to relocate the temporary worker accommodation closer to the approved wind farm site, supporting safer, more efficient and well-planned construction.

Project team update

The Spicers Creek project team continues to grow to support detailed design, with commercial and contracting activities underway.

Nick Treweeke has been appointed as Project Director to lead the team through this next phase, with a focus on project readiness, detailed planning and coordinating the activities required to advance the project. Nick grew up at Angledool, 400 km north of Dubbo, and still has family in the area.

The team is working closely with landowners to better understand site-specific features and continuing to engage across the region with contractors and suppliers who may be able to support future delivery. Other key workstreams include safety processes, contractor management and secondary planning approvals.



Temporary worker accommodation

Spicers Creek Wind Farm currently has approval for temporary worker accommodation (TWA) in Keswick Estate, 5km from Dubbo CBD.

During the wind farm procurement process, potential construction partners provided feedback that locating accommodation closer to site provides significant benefits by reducing fatigue, travel time and road safety risks associated with daily travel between Keswick Estate and the wind farm site.

As advised in our April 2026 newsletter, we have re-assessed our accommodation strategy and are lodging a modification to the existing development consent to locate TWA next to the approved Spicers Creek Wind Farm site.



The proposed TWA would:

- accommodate up to 600 non-local construction workers at the peak of construction
- be located on privately owned rural land adjacent to the approved wind farm
- be accessed via a new access track off Sweeneys Lane at Elong Elong, around 680m from the Golden Highway-Sweeneys Lane intersection
- operate only during the construction phase and be removed once construction is complete.

The modification report and supporting assessments for the proposed TWA will be published on the NSW Planning Portal. We will inform the community once the material is available to review and provide comment during the public exhibition period.



Renewable Energy Zone update

In August, Squadron Energy took part in EnergyCo's Community Roadshow events in Wellington, Dubbo and Dunedoo.

The roadshows gave community members an opportunity to learn more about the Central-West Orana Renewable Energy Zone (REZ), understand what it may mean for the region, and speak directly with representatives from Spicers Creek Wind Farm and other REZ projects.

The advanced wastewater treatment [facility opened](#) on 8 September following completion of construction. Delivered through a public private partnership between Squadron Energy and Dubbo Regional Council, the facility will help improve water security across the region.

The facility is capable of treating up to 700 megalitres of water per year, with up to 250 megalitres per annum available during the construction of Spicers Creek Wind Farm.
